



## **Temporary Waiver of ALHI Board Regulations to Extend Temporary Fee Reductions**

Effective January 25, 2021

---

On March 12, 2020, Governor Ralph Northam declared a state of emergency due to novel coronavirus (COVID-19). On May 26, 2020, the Governor proclaimed that the state of emergency continues to exist. In the Declaration of State of Emergency Due to Novel Coronavirus, [Amended Executive Order 51](#), the Governor directed state agencies to render appropriate assistance to prepare for and mitigate the effects of the outbreak. In doing so, he ordered authorization for the heads of executive branch agencies, on behalf of their regulatory boards as appropriate, and with the concurrence of their Cabinet Secretary, to waive any state requirement or regulation.

Pursuant to the authority granted to the agency head by Amended Executive Order 51 (2020), I hereby waive the regulatory expiration date of the reduced fees in Virginia Asbestos Licensing Regulation 18VAC15-20-53.B and Virginia Lead-Based Paint Activities Regulation 18VAC15-30-163.B, as well as subsections C of those sections, so as to extend the temporary fee reductions in subsections B.

This waiver shall remain in full force and in effect until superseded by regulatory action of the Virginia Board for Asbestos, Lead and Home Inspectors, unless sooner amended or rescinded by further executive order.
